About the Play

Henrik Ibsen's *A Doll's House* is a play about awakening – and the personal cost of clarity.

Set in late 19th century Norway, *A Doll's House* is a high-stakes domestic drama that remains as vital today when it was written in 1879. Nora Helmer lives a carefully constructed life built on a secret she has carried for years: a deceit she engaged in to save her husband Torvald's life. When a desperate blackmailer threatens to expose her secret, Nora is forced to confront the reality of her marriage, her life, and herself. The play explores the emotional cost of honesty, the struggle for self-determination, and the courage it takes to see one's life clearly.

The play is a landmark of modern drama and shocked audiences of the time with its naturalism and unflinching examination of marriage, gender roles, and societal expectations. In 2026 when expectations and societal pressures seem to be ever bearing, when personal choice and identity has been almost swapped for convenience and acceptance, *A Doll's House* is as relevant today as it ever has been. This new production aims to invite a 21st century audience to the play while remaining truthful to Ibsen's original text.

About the Director

Luke Monsour has been an active member of Brisbane's arts scene for more decades than he'd prefer to say and long-standing contributor to the Villanova Players. As a performer for VP, he has appeared in numerous productions including *Snapshots from Home* (2002), *The Busybody*, *Rumors*, *Lottie: The Musical*, *Indian Ink*, *The Real Inspector Hound*, *An Italian Straw Hat*, and 2019's *The Kursk* (as Admiral Popov).

As a director for the Villanova Players, Luke has helmed Tennessee William's *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*, Alan Ayckbourn's *Season's Greetings*, and most recently Joanna Murray-Smith's *Ninety* (2022). He aims to bring to every production a collaborative, actor-centred approach, valuing generosity, curiosity, and emotional truth in the rehearsal room.

For this production of *A Doll's House*, Luke is particularly interested in exploring moral complexity and emotional subtlety, creating space for actors to discover the humanity and inner life of each character.

About Villanova Players

Villanova Players is a community theatre group in Morningside. Established in 1948, we perform four Mainhouse shows a year, and two Short season productions. We produce plays of all varieties from classics to contemporary and the occasional musical.

Characters (Ages are indicative only)

NORA HELMER: Female, late 20s – 30s

A woman who appears playful, naïve, and dependent, but is revealed to have a complicated inner life that leaves her fundamentally in conflict with the social expectations that entrap her. Nora is not naïve or childish; she is learning to articulate truths she has long felt but never named.

TORVALD HELMER: Male, 30s – 40s

Nora's husband who is charming, articulate, socially respected and highly principled, embodying the rigid moral standards of patriarchal society. We are seeking actors who can make Torvald recognisably human, not villainous.

DOCTOR RANK: Male, 40s – 50s

A close family friend of the Helmers; he is witty, intelligent, and emotionally perceptive. Rank uses humour to mask loneliness and physical decline. The role requires subtlety, restraint, and the ability to communicate deep feeling without demanding attention.

KRISTINE LINDE: Female, 30s – 40s

Nora's school friend, a widow who has endured hardship and supported her family all her life; she is practical, grounded and emotionally mature.

NILS KROGSTAD: Male, 30s – 40s

A man marked by past disgrace and present desperation. Krogstad must be a threat, but also vulnerable. This is not a “villain” role, but a deeply human one.

Audition Requirements

Auditions will involve paired scene work from the play as well as short solo excerpts from the script.

Scripts will be provided — memorisation is *not* required. If you would like an excerpt ahead of the audition, please email below with the part you like to read.

We are interested in how actors listen, respond, and collaborate, not in polished performance.

The audition will be a group call and will consist of cold reads of some excerpts of the script.
