Play Synopsis

A woman carries her heart, broken into nineteen pieces, in a small paper bag. A man shrinks to half his former size after losing hope in love. A couple keep the love they have given each other in large red bags, or compresses the mass into the size of a diamond. These playful and surreal experiences are commonplace in the world of John Cariani's *Almost, Maine*, where on one deeply cold and magical Midwinter Night, the citizens of Almost -- not organised enough for a town, too populated for a wilderness -- experience the life-altering power of the human heart. Relationships end, begin, or change beyond recognition, as strangers become friends, friends become lovers, and lovers turn into strangers. Propelled by the mystical energy of the aurora borealis and populated with characters who are humorous, plain-spoken, thoughtful, and sincere, Almost, Maine is a series of loosely connected tales about love, each with a compelling couple at its centre and its own touch of sorcery.

About Villanova Players

Villanova Players is a community theatre group in Morningside, QLD.

Established in 1948, we perform four Mainhouse shows a year, and two Intermezzo productions. We produce plays of all varieties from classics to contemporary and have also been known to do the occasional musical.

Roles

Almost, Maine was written with the intent of a small cast. We are seeking six strong actors (three male-presenting, three female-presenting) who can portray a range of characters, emotions, and life stages. It should be noted that one of the male actors should be short to play the role of Man/Daniel to emphasise the meaning of the scene.

Villanova Players and the creative team of *Almost, Maine* are committed to diverse and inclusive casting. We strongly encourage performers from diverse backgrounds, including those of various races, ages, genders, disabilities, and neurodiversities.

A notable aspect is that this play portrays genuine chemistry among the characters and those around them. Actors will need to perform great emotion over long scenes.

Character Descriptions

Male Characters

- Pete Almost pessimistic but he truly loves Ginette although it's hard for him to admit.
- Steve Open, clueless and kind. He is clueless about the world due to his inability to feel pain, which is attributed to his disorder.
- Jimmy A guy whose broken heart makes it hard for him to speak his mind.
- Randy Broke his date's face while dancing. Ends up having feelings for his best friend Chad, but it's hard for him to admit it.
- Dave Not so tough, but loves Rhonda for who she is.
- East A repairman, calm and sincere.
- Lendall Longtime best friend to Gayle, an understanding and collected person who is trying to understand his girlfriend.
- Chad Was told he smelled by his date. He tells his best friend he has feelings for him.
- Phil A working man who gets in a fight with his wife after ice skating.
- Man/Daniel The ex of Hope, who has left the town, but his life has gone on and changed without her.

Female Characters

- Ginette Optimistic and loving toward Pete. A bit of a chatterbox who rambles on when she's nervous.
- Sandrine Jimmy's Ex who left him suddenly but is put together and sensitive towards Jimmy.
- Gayle Longtime girlfriend to Lendall, short-tempered, passionate and flustered woman who wants to be married.
- Hope A jittery woman who left her boyfriend to go off into the world, and has come back to see him.
- Glory A vulnerable, nervous and guilty hiker.
- Waitress/ Villian No nonsense, sassy waitress, who is meant for Jimmy.
- Marvalyn A self-protective nurse who is in a rough patch in her relationship.
- Marci The hardworking wife of Phil, who is angry with him over all the things his work has caused him to miss.
- Rhonda A tough, closed-off, and nervous woman who is awkward around Dave.
- Suzette Wife of Daniel

Content Warning

Multiple scenes require actors to be intimate with one another, particularly the characters East and Glory, Marvalyn and Steve, Lendall and Gayle, and Dave and Rhonda. Dave and Rhonda undress down to their undergarments; the comfort level and potential changes of this can be discussed with the directors.

Female Monologue

WOMAN. Yeah: My husband. Wes. I just wanted to say goodbye to him, 'cause he died recently. On Tuesday, actually. And, see, the northern lights — did you know this? — the northern lights are really the torches that the recently departed carry with them so they can find their way to heaven, and, see, it takes three days for a soul to make its way home, to heaven, and this is Friday! This is the third day, so, you see, I will see them, the northern lights, because they're him: He'll be carrying one of the torches. And, see, I didn't leave things well with him, so I was just hoping I could come here and say goodbye to him and not be bothered, but what you did there just a second ago, that bothered me, I think, and I'm not here for that, so maybe I should go II and find another yard — MAN. No! No! I'm sorry if I — ... if I've behaved in a way that I shouldn't have —

Male Monologue

MAN. (This speech is not an attack. It's more of a rumination — one that doesn't do much to make the woman feel better.) Oh, come on. You give yourself too much credit. He was young. That's all you need to get your hopes dashed: Be young. And everybody starts out young, so ... everybody gets their hopes dashed, and besides ... I don't think you really dashed his hopes. 'Cause if you dash somebody's hopes — well that's ... kind of a nice way to let 'em down, 'cause it hurts ... but it's quick. If you'd have said, "No," that would a been "dashing his hopes." (Beat. Maybe a little pointed here.) But you didn't say, "No." You said nothin'. You just didn't answer him. At all. And that's ... killin' hope the long, slow, painful way, 'cause it's still there just hangin' on, never really goes away. And that's ... kinda like givin' somebody a little less air to breathe every day. Till they die.
